1. Actions taken/working:

- a. Fairfax District has received approval to put several Al-Anon Books in Circulation through their Libraries. Virginia Al-Anon provided 10,000 Bookmarks for this effort.
- b. Fairfax District has also supported the State-wide distribution of Al-Anon Bookmarks in the Food Bank packages.
- c. Peninsula District supported the three day State Summer Institute of Addiction Studies in Williamsburg, Virginia with volunteers to man the Virginia Al-Anon table.
- d. Eastern Shore District shares their Meetings in the Local Newspaper.
- e. Discussing continued plans to bring Outreach Workshop/Dinner to Assembly.
